Three new local artists are being featured in State Senator Patty Ritchie’s Oswego, Jefferson and St. Lawrence County offices as part of the Senator’s effort to highlight local creative talent.

“Senator Patty Ritchie Celebrates Local Artists” launched in March, and since then has showcased more than a dozen artists.

The following artists are now being featured at the below locations:

- Oswego County, 46 East Bridge St., Oswego: Loie Mechetti, an award-winning artist from Phoenix.
- Jefferson County, 317 Washington St., Watertown: Marie (Ree) Ingalsbe, an award-winning, Watertown artist in her 90's who has created more than 100 different, original pieces of art.
- St. Lawrence County, 330 Ford St., Ogdensburg: Justin Fishel of Ogdensburg shoots high definition photos of St. Lawrence County landmarks, offering a new perspective on what are often familiar scenes.
