- e) Incurred medical and/or other significant expense (e.g., alternative housing); or
- f) A family member has been injured or died.

Volunteers will provide advice in the following areas: Providing guidance to gain more control over their finances: Assessing what financial decisions have to be made now, soon, and later Identifying resources for needed services and relief assistance (e.g., FEMA, SBA) Tips to prevent fraudulent services Budgeting / managing increased expenses (e.g., alternative living, clothing, medical) Debt management Tax relief and guidance Estate planning
