Schools wishing to participate in this year's event must submit their entry by April 5, 2013 via the Senator's website: www.young.nysenate.gov.

Students are encouraged not only to be creative in their project, but also to convey a real commitment to making the environment a better place. By educating students about the importance of recycling, they will learn to be creative in solving the problem of solid waste.
