"The Senate's online summer reading program offers a convenient opportunity for students and their parents to enjoy the benefits and the rewards of summer reading together. To participate in the Senate's online program, students and parents can visit www.nyread.com. Among other features, the site includes a recording journal, opportunities to share books with other family members and friends, and a series of popular summer reading lists. At the end of the program, participants will receive formal recognition from Senator O'Mara for their reading achievement.

Numerous studies have shown that children who engage in summer reading make greater academic gains than children who do not.

According to New York State Library officials, last year's "Summer Reading at New York Libraries" program featured the participation of 1.76 million young people statewide.
