

Senator Martins & Department of Financial Services to Hold Foreclosure Prevention Programs in Westbury and Hicksville

ISSUE: FORECLOSURE

Senator Jack M. Martins (R-Mineola) is partnering with the New York State Department of Financial Services (DFS) to provide services and assistance to homeowners facing foreclosure.

Senator Martins has arranged to have DFS' Mobile Foreclosure Relief Center to come to the community at the following locations:

• Wednesday, August 6th

10 am to 6 pm

Westbury Library (445 Jefferson Street, Westbury)

• Friday, August 8th

9 am to 5 pm

Hicksville Library (169 Jerusalem Avenue, Hicksville)

At both sites, DFS staff members will be on hand to speak individually with homeowners about their situation and:

- Assist homeowners in their efforts to obtain loan modifications and other relief;
- Provide information on available federal programs;
- Inform homeowners about their rights and answer questions about the foreclosure process; and
- Help homeowners seek resolutions with banks and mortgage servicers, as well as take complaints from homeowners who believe they were victims of predatory lending or other abuses.

Homeowners should bring copies of their mortgage documents, loan payment records, letters from their lenders or mortgage servicers, or any other information relevant to their personal situation which could be useful to DFS staff in helping to provide assistance. The program is open to everyone and no appointments are necessary.
