The Mayor revealed a detailed plan to reduce the amount of crime in public housing developments across New York City. Under the Mayor's new plan, \$210 Million would be dedicated to improving the overall safety in NYCHA developments across the five boroughs - by providing additional lighting and surveillance, less scaffolding and increased community center hours.
