In addition, I recently supported a new law that requires the NYS Department of Health (DOH) to establish an up-to-date website devoted solely to women's health. The website will provide information on 22 preventive services now covered at no cost to patients under the federal Affordable Care Act (ACA) – including breast cancer mammography screening for women over 40.

I will keep you posted on the website's progress and will continue to support initiatives that focus on breast cancer prevention, early detection and community-based education and support services.
