


Senator Young Congratulates Allegany Engine Company Member Jim Boser for 60 Years of Service

was honored for 60 years of service.

For 60 years he has been responding to alarms and helping to guide the department and the engine company as it grew from humble beginnings. Boser served as Chief for Allegany Fire Department from 1963 to 1965. Along with his membership in Allegany Engine Company, he also serves as a member of the Cattaraugus County Legislature.

Allegany Fire Department was formally founded in 1890 and provides fire and emergency medical services (EMS) coverage for over 100 square miles, including the towns of Allegany and Humphrey. The department also provides fire and EMS coverage for the campus of St. Bonaventure University.
