It's one of the most iconic images of World War II—a group of five United States Marines and a United States Navy corpsman, raising the American flag atop Mount Suribachi on the Japanese island of Iwo Jima. This month, dozens of United States veterans made the journey back to that same island, marking the 70th anniversary of one of the most iconic battles of WWII. These veterans represented the roughly 70,000 U.S. troops who took part in the 36 day battle, which is considered one of the bloodiest in history.

The stories of struggle and bravery during the Battle of Iwo Jima serve as examples of the selfless service exhibited by so many of our nation's veterans. In an effort to honor the service of these veterans—and so many more—I'm once again calling on people to nominate those who have served to the New York State

Senate's "Veterans Hall of Fame." This special program aims to honor and recognize outstanding veterans from the Empire State who have distinguished themselves both in military and civilian life.
