Local Elementary Students to Address Issue of Bullying in Annual “Senator for a Day” Contest

The students will be judged on originality, presentation and content. The finalists will read their essays before a panel of local leaders including attorney Peter Ferraiuolo, 68th Precinct NYPD

Lieutenant Thomas Gulotta, and Brooklyn Eagle reporter Paula Katinas.

The first place winner will be invited with their class to spend a day in the State Capitol in Albany. The second and third places winners will each be awarded a U.S. Savings Bon.
