Local Students Go "Inside Albany" WITH Senator Martins

Senator Jack M. Martins (R-7th Senate District) recently welcomed local high school students Joshua Curtis (Schreiber High School-Port Washington), William McNeill (Westbury High School), and Prajanan Senthilkumar (Manhasset High School) to the State Capitol in Albany.

The three students were in Albany to participate in the League of Women Voters New York State Education Foundation's annual Students Inside Albany conference. The conference is designed to increase high school students' awareness of their responsibility in a representative government and to provide the tools necessary for meeting that responsibility. Students from all across the state come to Albany to learn about state government and how individual citizens can get involved in the policy making process.
