By helping the parents in our community naturalize, their children may derive citizenship at no additional cost if they are under the age of 18 and meet certain requirements. As you may know, for students that become U.S. Citizens, there are additional opportunities for scholarships, financial aid, and student loans as they apply for college. There is also a microloan opportunity with free financial counseling available to help parents who cannot afford the \$680 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) filing fee or who do not qualify for the fee waiver.
