slaves dug up a mass grave of Union soldiers in a Confederate prison camp in order to give them a proper burial and to honor them for fighting so that they became freedmen.

On this solemn and important day in our collective history, let us stand together in saluting our fallen heroes and remembering those who have died in defense of freedom."
