## RITCHIE DELIVERS MORE THAN \$100,000 TO SUPPORT RAPE CRISIS SERVICES AT LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS

State Senator Patty Ritchie is marking Domestic Violence Awareness Month by announcing she has delivered \$116,000 in special funding to help support the efforts of local organizations seeking to stop the spread of violence, rape and sexual assault throughout Central and Northern New York.
