Additionally, on Monday, October 31st, in what is now one of the largest Halloween events in the City, Senator Golden along with the Southwest Brooklyn Parks Task Force and the Community Emergency Response Team, will again present the Haunted Halloween Walk and Fairy Tale Forest. The festivities will start at **Owl's Head Park, 67th Street and Colonial Road, at 3:30 p.m. and conclude at 8:30 p.m.** Among the attractions are rides, a food court, face painting, sand art and the FDNY Smokehouse. The event will also offer tours of the famed Haunted Walk and Fairytale Forest, and a costume contest is scheduled.
