WHEREAS, This remarkable man has truly lead by example; Thomas Lillis has diligently worked to raise significant funds to help LLS advance its mission of finding a cure for leukemia, lymphoma, Hodgkin's disease and myeloma, and to improve the quality of life of patients and their families; and

WHEREAS, The bass guitarist in a local band called The Kensingtons, Thomas Lillis and his bandmates have played at The Trait Music Hall for the past two years at an event called Rock for the Cure, and graciously donated all the proceeds to LLS; and

WHEREAS, A graduate of Canisius College, Thomas Lillis holds the title of Senior Vice President for Bank of America Merrill Lynch in Western New York; and

WHEREAS, With him throughout have been his wife, Karen, and their three children, all of whom feel privileged to be a part of his life and rejoice in his accomplishments; and
