WHEREAS, Upon the completion of his military service, Doyle L. Marquart went on to earn an Associate's degree from Finger Lakes Community College as well as a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from RIT in 1979; and

WHEREAS, Doyle L. Marquart began his career in law enforcement with the Seneca County Sheriff's Office in 1970; he became Chief of the Waterloo Police Department in 1978 and continued in this esteemed position for 38 years until his recent retirement; and

WHEREAS, In addition, Doyle L. Marquart has served as an Adjunct Professor at Finger Lakes Community College for more than 25 years; and

WHEREAS, A true asset to his community, Doyle L. Marquart has given tirelessly of his time and energies to such organizations as the Waterloo VFW and American Legion, the Celebrate Commemorate Committee, Seneca County Victim Impact Panel, Substance Abuse Committee and Drug Quiz Program, the Finger Lakes Law Enforcement Academy, and the New York State Police Chiefs Association; and

WHEREAS, Doyle L. Marquart is also a member of the Waterloo Fire Department and Safe Harbors Board of Directors; he is past chair of Seneca County Stop DWI, Seneca County Traffic Safety Board & Criminal Justice, as well as a founding member of the North Seneca Ambulance; and
