WHEREAS, The Jamesville-DeWitt Girls Varsity Basketball Team advanced to the State competition after winning the Section III Class A title and the Onondaga High School (OHSL) Freedom League; in the State tournament, the J-D Red Rams defeated two other teams before facing the number one-seeded Pittsford-Mendon Vikings in the final championship game; and

WHEREAS, The New York State Class A Basketball Championship game was a thriller from start to finish; the Red Rams trailed most of the first half, before putting on a furious rally to capture the lead in the third quarter; the Jamesville-DeWitt Girls Varsity Basketball Team eventually beat Pittsford-Mendon in a close finish with a final score of (48-46); and
