WHEREAS, Reverend Paul F. Angelicchio pursued his theological studies at Holy Apostles Seminary in Crowell, Connecticut, and earned his degree from St. Bernard's Seminary in Rochester, New York; and

WHEREAS, On May 7th, 1977, Reverend Paul F. Angelicchio was ordained into the priesthood by Bishop Frank Harrison; and

WHEREAS, Over the years, Reverend Paul F. Angelicchio has served many congregations in various capacities including Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of Lourdes Parish, Director and Founder of the Corcorn Faith Center, Parochial Vicar at St. Ann's Church, Parochial Vicar at Our Lady of Pompei Church, Pastor of Holy Family Church, and Pastor of Our Lady of Pompei/St. Peter's Church; in addition, he held the title of Police Chaplain for the City of Syracuse for 22 years; and

WHEREAS, Currently, The Reverend Paul F. Angelicchio is the Pastor of St. John the Baptist and Transfiguration Church in Rome, New York; a native son of the Church, he officiated his first Mass on May 8, 1977; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when a person of such noble aims and accomplishments is brought to our attention, it is appropriate to publicly and jubilantly proclaim and commend that individual for the edification of others; now, therefore, be it
