

State Budget Allocates Funding for Communities to Fill Potholes

NEW CITY, NY– Senator David Carlucci (D-Rockland/Westchester) announced that the State budget sends nearly \$4 million to Rockland County and local governments, including Ossining in Westchester, for road repairs, specifically for potholes and other damage resulting from extreme winter weather.
