

Sen. Helming Announces Romulus Winery As 2017 Governor's Cup Winner

The nationally recognized competition highlights the best of New York State's wine, spirits, and ciders, and the Governor's Cup is the most prestigious award in the competition. The competition is organized by the Canandaigua-based New York Wine & Grape Foundation.

Three Brothers Wineries & Estates in Geneva received two awards for its 2016 Zweigelt/Cabernet Sauvignon – Best Red Wine in the Best of Category awards and Best Vinifera Red Blend in the Best of Class awards – as well as Best Hybrid White in the Best of Class awards for its Nearly Naked.

"We are thrilled and excited to have won the Governor's Cup and all of these other honors. We have a wonderful staff here at Buttonwood Grove Winery. I couldn't be happier particularly for our winemaking team of Sue Passmore and Ian Barry. Thirsty Owl Wine Company in Ovid earned Best Diamond in the Best of Class awards for its 2016 Diamond and Best Other Red Vinifera Varietal in the Best of Class awards for its 2015 Malbec. Goose Watch Winery won Best Dessert Wine in the Best of Category awards for its Classic Cream Sherry, while Lucas Vineyards in Interlaken received Best Dry Riesling in the Best of Class awards for its 2015 Dry Riesling.

"Congratulations to all of the wineries in the Finger Lakes region that won awards during the New York Wine & Food Classic. The beverage industry in the region touches many other industries – agriculture and tourism, to name a couple – so it is important that we all keep working together to maintain this vibrant, award-winning industry," Senator Helming said.
