Fortunately, State Senator Kevin Parker is working to pass Senate Bill S6937 that if signed into law, would designate Good Friday as a public holiday in the State of New York.

Currently, Good Friday is a state holiday in 12 states: Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Hawaii, Indiana, Kentucky, Louisiana, New Jersey, North Carolina, North Dakota, Tennessee, and Texas. It is time for New York State to stop lagging behind and recognize Good Friday as a public holiday on behalf of the many observers across our great State,” said Senator Parker.
