For each student recognized as an "Akshar All-Star" Senator Akshar presents them with a tshirt, framed certificate and a challenge coin.

At **Susquehanna Valley High School**, Akshar recognized senior **Alyssa Lezotte** for her dedication to volunteer work at Susquehanna Valley Middle School. Through her work in physical education classes, Alyssa serves an passionate, supportive role model, as well friend and mentor to the middle school students.
