

Senator Montgomery and Assemblyman Crespo's bill to provide jury duty exemption for breastfeeding women passes Senate (S748)



Senator Velmanette Montgomery and Assemblyman Marcos Crespo's legislation to provide jury duty exemption for breastfeeding women passes Senate (S748). Jury duty exerts its demands on all who are called to serve, including women who are breastfeeding their infants.
