

Ritchie: \$20,000 to Enhance School Reading Programs

As "National Reading Month" continues, State Senator Patty Ritchie is announcing \$20,000 in special funding to support elementary-level reading programs in ten school districts throughout Jefferson, St. Lawrence and Oswego Counties.
