As we face the highest number of confirmed measles cases in recent history, it is necessary to implement measures to curtail this alarming outbreak and prevent future ones from ever happening. By setting stronger, more uniform statewide vaccination standards and further educating New Yorkers about the effectiveness of immunizations, we are taking action to protect our communities' public health.
