LONG ISLAND CITY, N.Y. – Senate Deputy Leader Michael Gianaris asked the Queens Public Library to increase mobile book services for residents of Hunters Point. While area residents still wait for the completion of a news library in their neighborhood.

“Hunters Point is a thriving vibrant neighborhood with young families who need library services,” said **Senate Deputy Leader Michael Gianaris**. “I ask the Queens Public Library to

accommodate this need while we await the completion of the long-anticipated Hunters Point Library.”

“The Hunters Point community is eager for public library service to launch in the community. As we wait for the completion of Hunters Point Library, an additional day of mobile library service would provide greater access to library materials, especially to children who attend school nearby,” said **Meghan Cirrito, President, Friends of the Court Square Library.**

Hunters Point has been awaiting completion of a new library building for many years. One of the fastest-growing neighborhoods in New York, it is home to young families with school-aged children and schools including PS/IS 78 and Hunters Point Middle School.
