

O'Mara blasts latest Senate Democrat proposal favoring criminals over crime victims

Albany, N.Y., October 31—State Senator Tom O'Mara (R,C,I-Big Flats) today continued to criticize the state Senate's extreme liberal downstate Democrat leadership for their efforts to "radically redefine the idea of criminal justice in New York State."

O'Mara blasted proposed legislation (S6821), introduced in the Senate on Wednesday by extreme liberal downstate Senator Kevin Parker, a Democrat from Brooklyn, calling for the state Department of Corrections and Community Supervision (DOCCS), together with state and local boards of election, to establish a voter registration and voting process for inmates in correctional facilities, including felons.

Democrat senators are pushing legislation to grant parole hearings to dangerous inmates sentenced to life without parole, and to let felons to sit on juries.
