WHEREAS, Born in 1941, in Nottingham, United Kingdom, Dr. M. Stanley Whittingham received his bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in the 1960s from the University of Oxford before coming to the United States as a post-doctoral fellow at Stanford University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. M. Stanley Whittingham began his illustrious career at Binghamton University in 1988, after 16 years at Exxon Research and Engineering Company where he received the patent for a rechargeable lithium-ion battery; and

WHEREAS, A truly brilliant scientist, Dr. M. Stanley Whittingham is Binghamton University's first ever Nobel Laureate; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when individuals of such noble aims and accomplishments are brought to our attention, they should be celebrated and recognized by all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
