Senator Pam Helming today announced that Canandaigua Academy School senior Kevin Dennis has been nominated by New York State Education Interim Commissioner Shannon Tahoe for the U.S. Presidential Scholars program. Senator Helming had recommended Kevin to the Commissioner for nomination.

Kevin is currently a National Merit Scholarship Semifinalist and a member of the National Honor Society. Outside of the classroom, Kevin is a member of the school

swim team and cross-country team. He also serves as the president of the school choir and has earned all state and all county honors for choir.

According to Canandaigua Academy High School Counselor Michelle Jones, who recommended Kevin to Senator Helming, Kevin is considered to be a “shining star” at his school and is an exceptional candidate for this scholarship program as he is driven, compassionate, kind and funny.

Kevin is one of 25 high school seniors from across New York State whom Interim Commissioner Tahoe nominated for the program, a list that includes 10 male students, 10 female students, and five career and technical education students. The Presidential Scholar recognition is one of the nation’s highest honors for high school students. Every year, one young man and one young woman from each state are named as Presidential Scholars.
