

Ritchie: More than \$400,000 Awarded to Local Libraries

State Senator Patty Ritchie is announcing libraries throughout Central and Northern New York are set to receive more than \$400,000 in public library construction funds to help make upgrades to their facilities.

Funding is part of a \$34 million capital fund appropriation in the 2019/2020 State Budget for construction and renovation of public libraries and library systems in New York State.

Grants awarded in Senator Ritchie's district will help local libraries and the North Country Library System to make important upgrades, including those that will increase energy efficiency, improve handicapped accessibility, enhance security and more.

"Our local libraries work incredibly hard to offer educational and cultural opportunities in the communities where they exist," said Senator Ritchie.

"Many libraries—especially in the region I represent—are older structures that are in desperate need of repairs and upgrades. Through these grants, our local libraries will receive the assistance they need to strengthen their facilities and continue to provide the important services patrons depend on."

Details on the projects in Senator Ritchie's district receiving funding are as follows:

Library Name	Amount	Project Description Replace the library ramp to
Canton Free Library	\$24,000.00	provide access to the library for all patrons including those with physical disabilities.
Morley Library (Branch of Canton)	\$28,054.00	Bring electrical up to code and upgrade the kitchen.
Carthage Free Library	\$5,316.00	Purchase and install "Carthage Free Library" sign at entry of new parking lot. Reconstruct the 2nd floor
Hay Memorial Library	\$24,443.00	space by demolishing a storage closet to construct a multi-use classroom and kitchen/craft space.
Hepburn Library of Madrid	\$16,388.00	Install a hot water heater and furnace to meet needs and enhance energy efficiency.
Heuvelton Free	e \$9,782.00	Replace the furnace, installing a central air conditioner, and upgrading all lighting to LED.

Install a security system and North Country \$29,085.00 re-configure the training Library System room. Installing drainage system and rehabilitating walls Ogdensburg affected (using a "water-\$18,375.00 Public Library repellent" or "breathable" coating recommended by SHPO). Replace an inoperable, Phoenix Public \$38,071.00 inefficient, and outdated Library HVAC system. Purchase an existing building to convert to a Richville Free library. Install new \$90,946.00 Library carpeting, LED lighting, and data runs. Roswell P. Replace 12 domed windows Flower in the historic part of the \$113,468.00 Memorial library. Library Thousand Install an HVAC mini-split Island Park unit, update electrical and \$16,073.00 Library add LED lighting.
