HYDE PARK, NY – Senator Sue Serino today was officially sworn-in for her fourth term as State Senator, representing the 41<sup>st</sup> Senate District. Serino was honored to have been sworn in by Dutchess County Family Court Judge Joseph Egitto at her Senate Office in Hyde Park.

The proposal includes initiatives that prioritize restarting our local economies, rethinking how New York State operates, and renewing a commitment to New York State's residents to ensure strong, robust communities.
