WHEREAS, In addition, Mother Marie Smalls volunteered as a Den Mother for the Cub Scouts and "Troop Mother" of the Boy Scouts of America; she was also an Assistant Troop Leader for the Girl Scouts of America; and

WHEREAS, For many years, Mother Marie Smalls was an active member of both the Urban League and the NAACP in White Plains; and

WHEREAS, With her zest for life, this exceptional semi-supercentenarian has inspired and enhanced the lives of her family and friends; she has truly enriched the lives of those around her through her joyous and sincere love for others and through the quiescent charm and wisdom which comes only from a fullness of years; and

WHEREAS, It is the intent of this Legislative Body to publicly recognize those who have reached such a remarkable age and who have witnessed and celebrated the innovations, cultural developments and awesome achievements of this country during the last century, while themselves contributing to the growth and excellence of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
