From now until Tuesday, April 19, teachers of students in grades K-6 are asked to submit their posters on Senator Addabbo's website here: <https://www.nysenate.gov/senators/joseph-p-addabbo-jr>. All submissions must be uploaded to the website by April 19, 2021.

In order to have students' posters on Addabbo's Senate website, teachers must fill out their class and school information first, and then enter ALL the students on the form. Entries should be photographed and submitted electronically, preferably in jpeg or pdf format. Please enter each student individually, as the website cannot accept a single pdf with all students grouped together.

"In the past, I have had many of our local, younger residents participate in the rain barrel, paper shredding and electronic recycling events I sponsor throughout the district. Here is

another way they can show their interest in our environment," Addabbo concluded.
