WHEREAS, In addition, Lieutenant Deborah Harris enjoyed overseeing and working with the inmates on several horticultural projects such as the annual vegetable garden at the jail and tending to the landscaping at the Sheriff's Office headquarters; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Deborah Harris led an inmate sewing program which provided blankets to the homeless veterans and the area's domestic violence shelters, and most recently, she and her team made and donated hundreds of handmade facial masks for people to wear during the COVID-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, Throughout her tenure, Lieutenant Deborah Harris truly served the residents of Oneida County with compassion, integrity, and fairness, attributes which will forever serve as an example for her fellow officers; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that those dedicated public servants who unselfishly devote their lives to the preservation of order and the protection of others are worthy and due full praise for their commitment and noble endeavors; now, therefore, be it
