

Ms. Belokopitsky also led collections of donations for St. Joseph's House, Unity House and Hope 7 in Troy, Vanderheyden Hall in North Greenbush, and Rensselaer County senior citizens. Ms. Belokopitsky also is active in the PTA and Special Education PTA at Gardner Dickinson, raising funds to support Gardner Dickinson remaining open full-time during the pandemic.

At the behest of Rep. Bella Abzug, in 1971 and passed in 1973, the U.S. Congress designated August 26 as "Women's Equality Day." The date was selected to commemorate the 1920 certification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution, granting women the right to vote. This was the culmination of a massive, peaceful civil rights movement by women that had its formal beginnings in 1848 at the world's first women's rights convention, in Seneca Falls, New York. The observance of Women's Equality Day not only commemorates the passage of the 19th Amendment, but also calls attention to women's continuing efforts toward full equality. Workplaces, libraries, organizations, and public facilities now participate with Women's Equality Day programs, displays, video showings, or other activities.
