- 1. Why should children be immunized against COVID if they are not dying from it in the numbers seen in older adults?
- 2. I heard only children with medical conditions need to be immunized, is this true? What about healthy kids?
- 3. Why should I have my child immunized when the adult vaccination rate is high and the overall percent positivity rate, in Nassau and Suffolk is lower than the rest of the country?
- 4. Is the data the FDA used to make its determination on the safety of vaccination sound? Can you explain it to me?
- 5. <u>Have we really looked at the children who were immunized long enough to know these</u> vaccines are safe and won't harm children in the long-term?
- 6. What side effects should I look for after vaccination?
- 7. Where can I get vaccinated?
