this successful business brought top name entertainment to the Broome
County Arena and venues across the Northeastern United States, some of

Director of Entertainment for the 1980 Winter Olympic Games in Lake
Placid, New York; this was a first for the Olympics, which ever since

WHEREAS, Edward V. Green's commitment to excellence, and his spirit of humanity, carried over into all fields of enterprise, including charitable and civic endeavors; he will be remembered for his many acts of kindness and generosity, and his commitment to volunteering; and

WHEREAS, Predeceased by his father and best friend, Robert J. Green, Sr.; his mother, Josephine; and four siblings, Edward V. Green is survived by his loving and devoted wife, Teresa (Terry) Cortese-Green; sister-in-law, Jean; nephews, Scott (Amy), Christopher (Jennifer), and Craig; and nieces, Emily (Matt) and Island; as well as great nieces and nephews; furthermore, he is survived by his Shea family cousins; his wife's family, Corinne and Gene Purtell and the Colavito's; his favorite "sister-in-law," Rose Papa; and many wonderful friends and neighbors; and
