WHEREAS, When the New York basketball world was focused on Reed, Frazier, DeBusschere, Bradley and Barnett, the Rye hard courts were dominated by the winning roster consisting of Carl Hickson, George MacGlennon, Willie Totten, Marvin Kennedy, Chris Avery, Mark Peterson, Mark Bockeloh, Steve Verille, George Burkhardt, Jim Garrity, Mack Cunningham, Paul Stafford, Jeff Kaplan and Paul Ryan who brought the play-making and clutch shooting to their championship run; and

WHEREAS, From backyard hoops around town, to the courts at Rye Rec and the school gyms, these young athletes learned their skills while growing up playing other sports in other seasons and enjoying the comradery of competition and friendship which would evolve into outstanding basketball players ready to excel when good play counted most; and

WHEREAS, The 1972 Cagers had the support of the community, parents, family and friends drawn to watch an outstanding team led by Coach Cliff Clinton for their historic run; and
