WHEREAS, In that same year, the first radio drama, "The Wolf" was performed by the WGY Players and the first remote broadcast was held at Yale and Harvard Universities; WGY also initiated the first two-way communication to England; and

WHEREAS, In addition to its informative programming, WGY has served its community in numerous other capacities, such as raising significant funds for various children's charities and the children's hospital at Albany Medical Center; and

WHEREAS, The success of WGY is in direct correlation to the efforts of its staff, whose involvement is, and always has been, characterized

by an impressive commitment, an unbridled enthusiasm, and an uncompromising standard of excellence in all endeavors on behalf of the institution and the community it serves; and

WHEREAS, For 100 years, WGY has served the Capital Region with integrity and devotion, continuously striving to meet the needs of its listeners and viewers through entertainment and enlightenment; now, therefore, be it
