## Students in grades K-6 in Addabbo's district can submit artwork for NYS Senate Earth Day Poster Celebration

The goal of this celebration is to encourage children to develop an awareness of the environment and its resources. Teaching children about the importance of recycling and waste reduction is critical as we face the environmental challenges of the 21st Century.

"We teach our children to respect and protect their homes, their schools, and their neighborhoods, but we also need to include the place we all live to that list: our planet," Addabbo said. "This initiative is a great way to get young children involved in learning about the environment and how we can all work together to help protect the planet. I encourage teachers from all across my district to get their students involved and submit their creative pieces to be featured on my Senate website.

All submissions must be uploaded to the website by April 13, 2022.

In order to have students' posters on Addabbo's Senate website, teachers must fill out their class and school information first, and then enter ALL the students on the form. Entries should be photographed and submitted electronically, preferably in jpeg or pdf format. Please enter each student individually, as the website cannot accept a single pdf with all students grouped together.
