WHEREAS, With a workforce of close to 1,000 professionals in Rockland, Westchester and Orange Counties, Jawonio provides lifespan services from infants through end of life with a variety of services including early intervention, special education preschool, summer education, vocational and employment services, residential and day services and recovery based mental health services and care management; and

WHEREAS, From its humble beginnings as a sleepover camp, Jawonio currently supports 3,500 individuals and their families from a new 75,000 square foot state of the art facility for their staff, programs and services; and

WHEREAS, Under the luminous leadership of CEO Randi Rios-Castro, Jawonio remains true to its mission of advancing the independence, well-being and equality for people with special needs; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that those organizations which enhance the well-being and vitality of their community and have shown a long and sustained commitment to excellence certainly have earned the recognition and applause of all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it
