WHEREAS, With a steadfast and unwavering commitment to his community, Charles E. Sexton served on numerous Boards of Directors, and ushered at Holy Trinity Church for more than 50 years; and

WHEREAS, Charles E. Sexton died on Friday, June 18, 2021, at the age of 89; predeceased by his wife, Deborah, and his daughter, Tanya, he is survived by his sons, Adam (Michelle) and Jared; a grandson, Malcolm; and two sisters, Maxine and Cheryl; as well as many nieces, nephews and friends; and

WHEREAS, Charles E. Sexton was renowned as a forward thinking, creative and proud community member; today's current recreation programs are a testament to this extraordinary man and his vision for a community recreation program; and
