WHEREAS, Devoted to making his community a better place to live, work and play, Charles J. Diamond founded Kids Count!, now Arsenal City Kids, in 2000, and is a member of numerous local boards of directors and

civic organizations; and

WHEREAS, For his steadfast and unremitting commitment to his community, Charles J. Diamond has been the recipient of numerous awards and accolades; and
