WAPPINGERS FALLS, NY – Senator Sue Serino recently joined the Wappingers Central School District to host 'Plan for a Future That Works!' – a skilled trades fair aimed at giving local students and young adults a first-hand look at different career opportunities available in the trades industry throughout the Hudson Valley. Over 70 businesses, organizations, and unions participated in the event at Roy C. Ketcham High School, and well over two hundred students and residents were in attendance.

"As someone who did not take the traditional path, I was thrilled to be able to partner with the Wappingers Central School District to host our first in-person Skilled Trades Fair to show students there is not a 'one-size-fits-all' approach when it comes to planning your future," said Senator Sue Serino.
