relocating to New York City in 1950, where she continued to practice her profession at the Green and Gold Beauty Salon; and

WHEREAS, Irene Beatrice Owens then met and married the love of her life, Jefferson Franklin Owens, and together they raised five children, Evelyn Joyce, Jeffrey Allen, Thomas Jerome, Jacqueline and Mamie Jean; and

WHEREAS, As a stay-at-home mom, Irene Beatrice Owens dedicated her life to creating a loving home for her family; in addition to filling her days with activities which involved her children, she also cared for some of her nieces and nephews daily; and

WHEREAS, As her children married and left home, Irene Beatrice Owens, never one to sit still, trained for and worked briefly in the Home Health field until she retired in 1994; and

WHEREAS, At the age of 72, she began a new chapter of her life as a volunteer at the Allen Senior Community Center, where she worked with the Allen Boutique, daily lunch program and as the trip coordinator, often traveling to various regions of the United States with its senior residents; and

WHEREAS, Irene Beatrice Owens, with her zest for life, has inspired and enhanced the lives of her family and friends; some of her hobbies have been BINGO, computer classes, jewelry and doll making; and

WHEREAS, A Lifetime Member and a Legacy Life Member of the National Council of Negro Women, Inc. Queens County Section, this woman of great faith is currently a member of the New Jerusalem Worship Church in Jamaica, New York; and

WHEREAS, This exceptional centenarian has experienced the incredible joys and sorrows characteristic of and reserved for those with the stamina and courage to savor a full life; and
