WHEREAS, The son of Michael and Patty Broder, Sean is a member of Boy Scouts of America Troop 15, New Rochelle, New York; and

WHEREAS, A graduate of New Rochelle High School, Sean Thomas Broder was a member of Model Congress, the Swim Team, and various clubs including Ignite and the Irish Culture Club; and

WHEREAS, Beginning his scouting career as a Tiger Cub in New Rochelle Cub Scout Pack 15, Sean Thomas Broder earned his Arrow of Light and crossed over to New Rochelle Troop 15 in 2014, here he attended Camp Read Scout reservation summer camps and went on to become a Senior Patrol Leader; one of the highlights of his Scouting career was a five day 37-mile trek on Northville Lake Placid trail in High Peaks Wilderness area of Adirondack Park which included summitting Street Mountain and an excursion to Nye Mountain; and
