Senator Bill Weber Sworn into Office

Surrounded by family, friends, religious leaders, and elected officials, William "Bill" Weber (R, C) was sworn into office as the Senator for New York's 38th Senate District, representing Clarkstown, Haverstraw, Orangetown, and Ramapo.

Two hundred guests filled the Fire Training Center in Pomona to celebrate this momentous occasion and hear from speakers, including Rockland County Executive Ed Day and Clarkstown Supervisor George Hoehmann.

Rabbi Abraham Horowitz gave the invocation, Suffern Judge Earnest Buonocore swore in Senator Weber, followed by Pastor Greg Merriweather saying the benediction.
