HONORING Spice upon the occasion of her designation as recipient of an Entrepreneurial Award by the Young, Gifted & Black Entrepreneurial Awards Program

WHEREAS, Spice is a Jamaican dancehall recording artist, singer, songwriter and businesswoman, who is known throughout the world as the "Queen of Dancehall"; and

WHEREAS, Throughout her exemplary career thus far, Spice has been the recipient of numerous awards and accolades including the 2022 Power & Music Award and was named Female Artist of the Year seven consecutive times by YVA; and

WHEREAS, Spice was the first female hard-core dancehall artist to be nominated for a Grammy, had the most streamed solo hit by a female artist in dancehall history and was the first dancehall artist to hit number one on both single and album iTunes reggae charts; and

WHEREAS, This award recipient exemplifies the best of her community, by virtue of her energy, vision, and dedication, commanding the greatest respect among her friends and colleagues, and within the community at large; and

WHEREAS, It is the custom of this Legislative Body to commend individuals of outstanding character, who have shown initiative and commitment toward constantly pursuing higher goals for themselves, and acting as role models of leadership to be emulated by both peers and

young people; now, therefore, be it
