McCarthy joined the staff of The Buffalo Evening News as a general assignment reporter; later, he worked police, state government and transportation beats before becoming a political reporter in 1992, the position from which he officially retired in 2023; WHEREAS, Since then, Robert J. McCarthy has covered all major elections in Western New York and New York State as a whole, including 14 national conventions; and

WHEREAS, Robert J. McCarthy has been the recipient of numerous awards and accolades for his steadfast and unremitting commitment to his profession including the 2006 New York State Publishers Association First Place Award with a colleague for stories on "Irregularities in the State Liquor Authority" and a 2002 series of articles on how State Supreme Court candidates are chosen was nominated by The News for a Pulitzer Prize; and

WHEREAS, Robert J. McCarthy was also named one of New York's 10 most influential political journalists by Brill's Content magazine, and serves as a panelist for various local and statewide debates; and
